2020: An NGO's perspective in pandemic and lockdown

The year 2020 was really a wash out, from many perspectives. It was spent staying at home by almost all of us, or, working from home. As all of us adapted to working from home, there was a sense of: what is happening to kids with heart disease. Obviously, there were kids to be born, kids who were listed for surgery.

Even the lockdown period we did not waste our time. We worked on increasing our backend strengths. This included the software we were using, the way we stored our data, how we would digitize, where we would store. That is when we established Green Rope and our CRM after trying out several training for staff started and subsequently percolated to all.

We also used the lockdown period to organise ourselves with several proposals. The proposal making process was standardised for each program, with excel and blocks of word docx files making a fresh proposal writing smoother.

We also standardized our budgeting for various proposals there by decreasing the cost of our manpower and staff. It took us by November to start getting children operated and that continued right

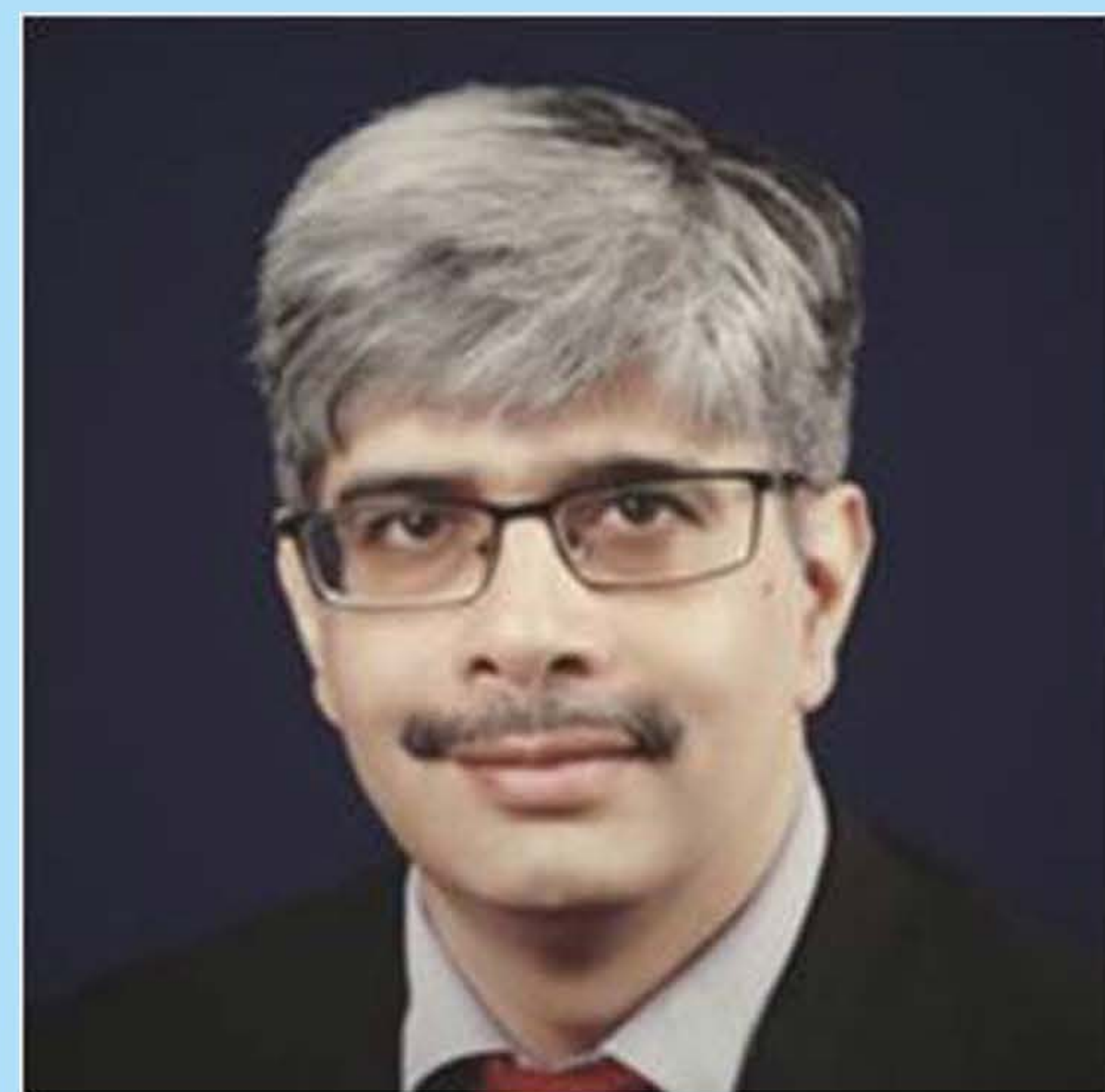
till March. Exploration for more associations increased and finalised including with Rotary. Exploration with AIIMS and with Sathya Sai continued and shall continue. Starting a new program and dreaming of making all programs bigger. One such program was the PH Lifecare program. We are working towards making this program to cover the whole of North India.

Finally, as always, I emphasize that our strength is our Human Resource. Core team of Sunita and Abhijit have really put in their sweat and toil. They subsequently added Ashlesha and Deepa to the team and finally Mohd. Yusuf.

Above all, the fact that nobody in the team got covid, in spite of dealing with patients. This is the biggest victory.

Core focus is to cover all aspects related to congenital heart diseases in children which includes pediatric echocardiographic screening, diagnosis, treatment, creating awareness, knowledge sharing, training of doctors and advocacy.

WHY CONGENITAL HEART DISEASES?

Congenital Heart Diseases (CHD)s are one of the most common birth defects. The disease burden is more in developing countries because of high birth rate and inadequate health infrastructure.

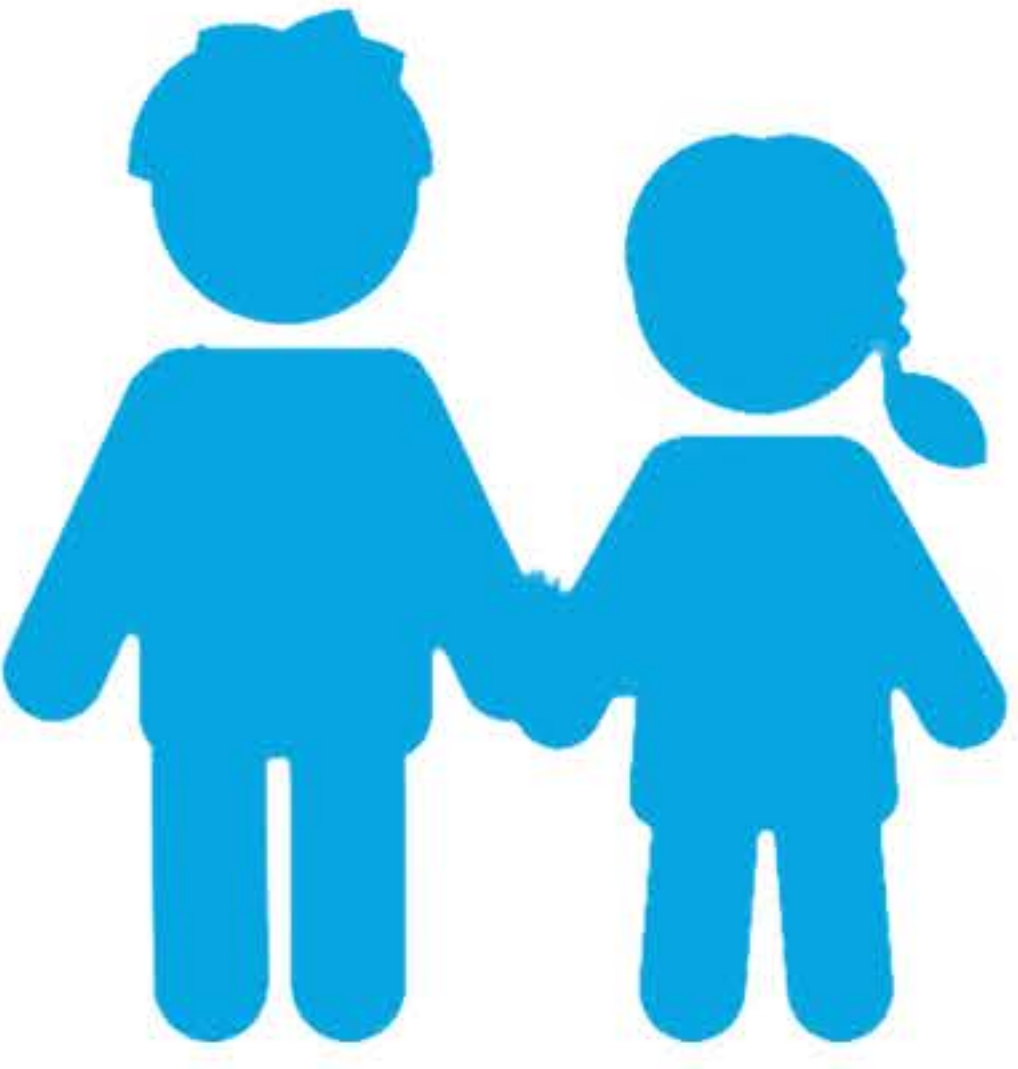

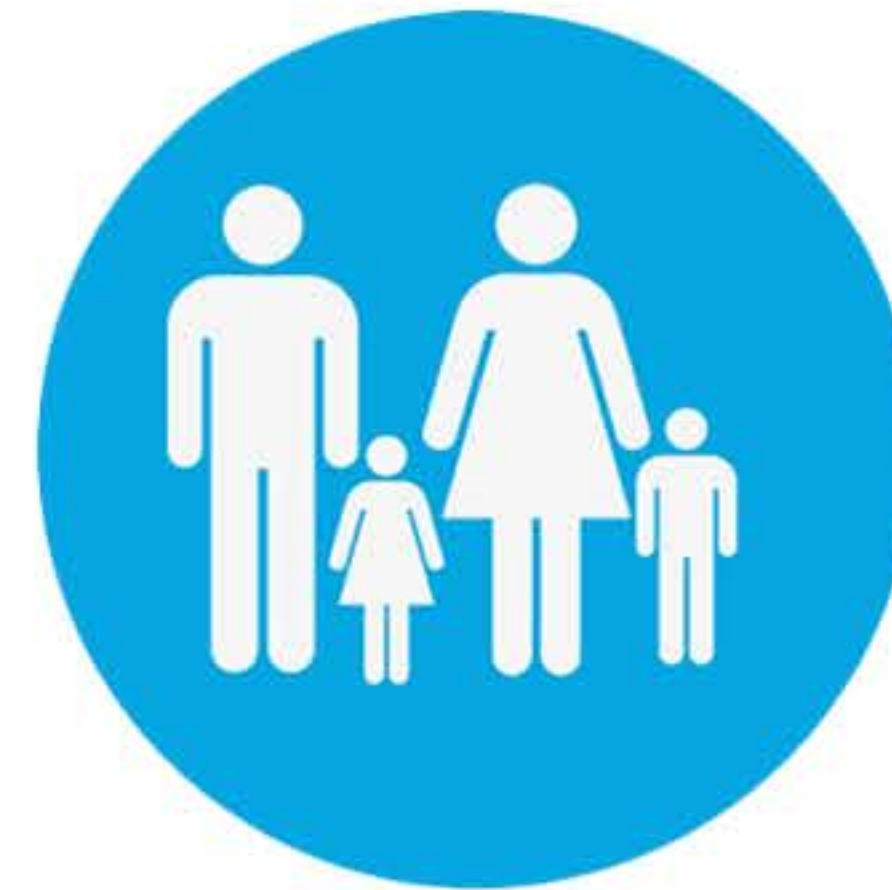

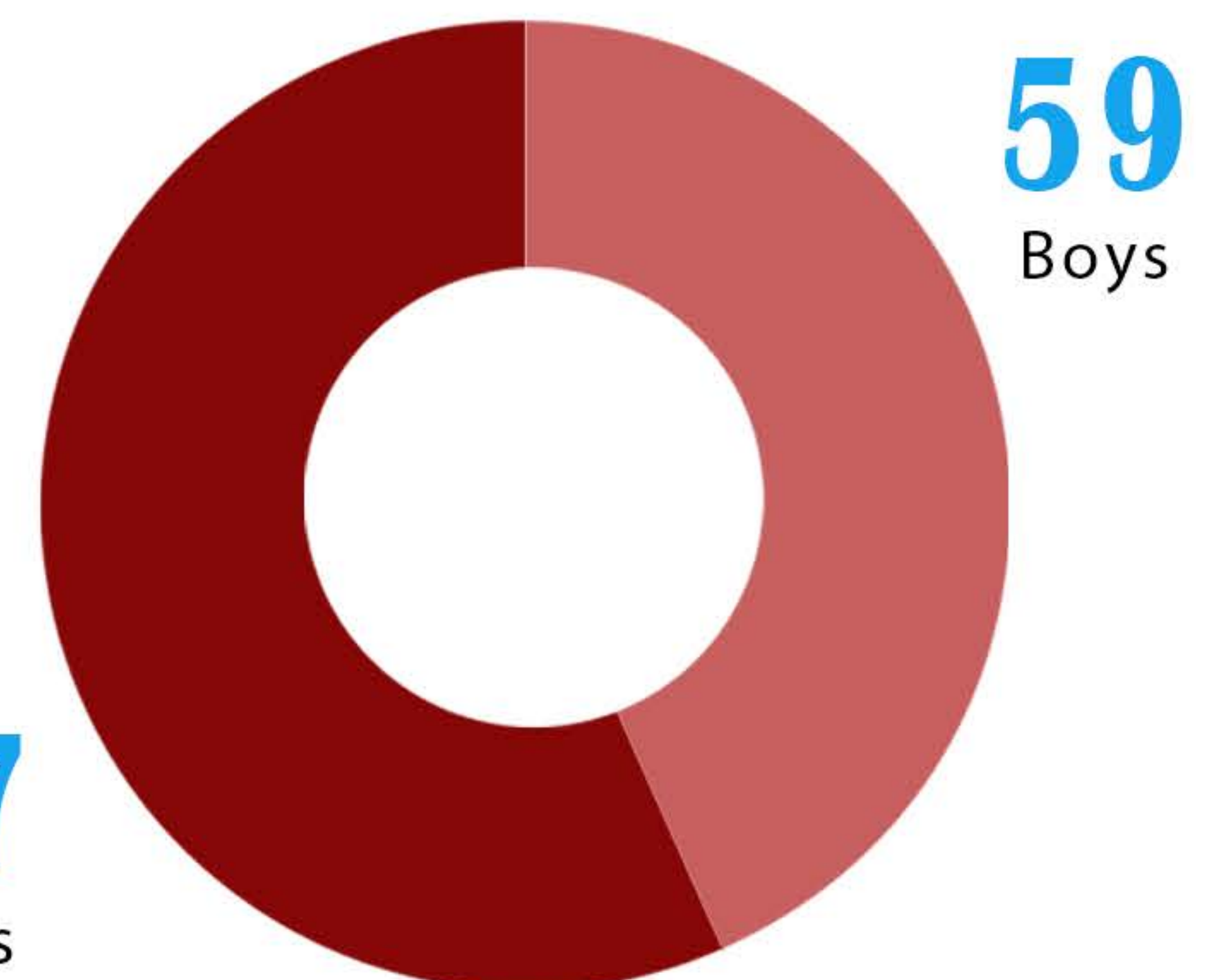
OUR PROGRAMS

PraDAAN®: Paediatric Cardiac OPD



We offer free/discounted screening at Delhi, Siliguri and Jalandhar to children (0 to 18 years) from underprivileged families to diagnose any type of congenital heart diseases (CHD). Counselling for disease management, nutritional importance and further support for treatment is also provided under the program.

A total of 136 children were screened under PraDAAN in the past year.

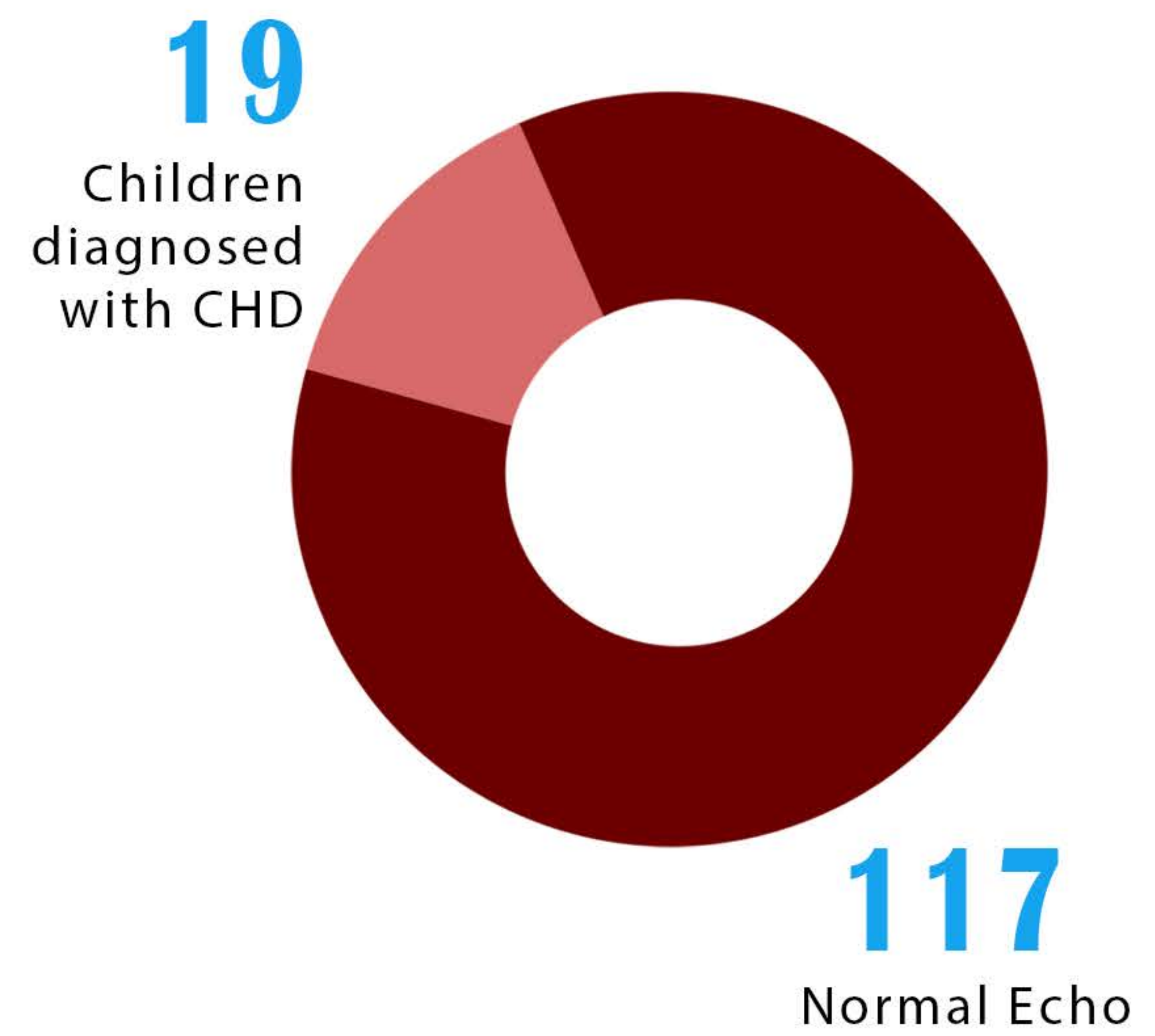


Gender analysis of the children screened - 77 were girls and 59 were boys.

CHF HRIDAAN®: Financial assistance Program for Treatment

Patients who get diagnosed with any type of CHD and parents/ family is unable to fund the treatments are registered under this program. The registration process involves due diligence based on submission of address proof, income certificate and identity by the parent/guardian to be certified by local government authorizing authority. The parents / caregivers of the patients are also counselled about the fundraising and the treatment process. Hand holding is provided to the family during the pre, during and post the treatment of the child.

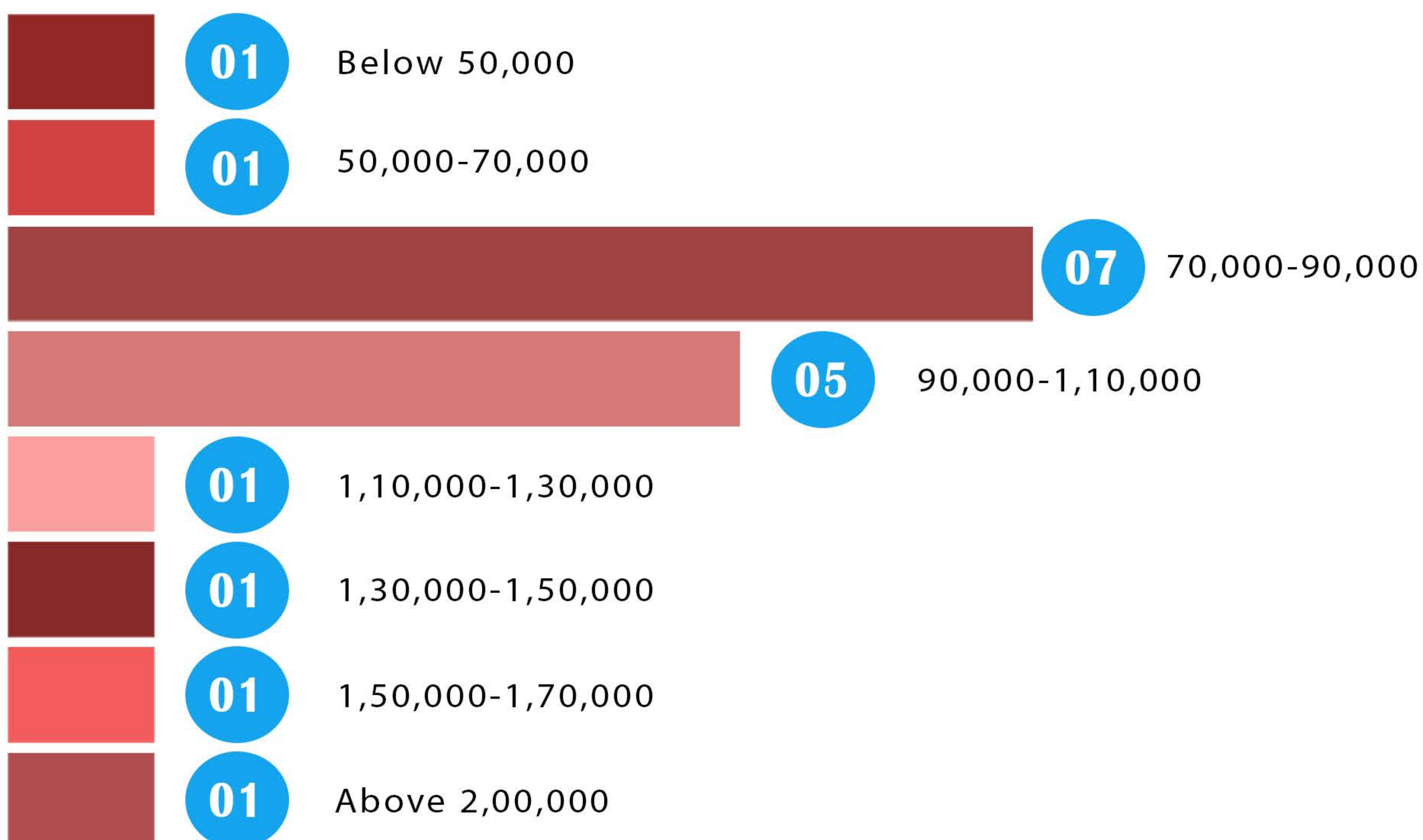
During 2020-21, Out of the total screenings done, 19 children who were diagnosed with CHD and underwent successful operations.



The diagnosis analysis: Out of total 136 screenings, 19 were diagnosed with CHD and 117 were normal echo

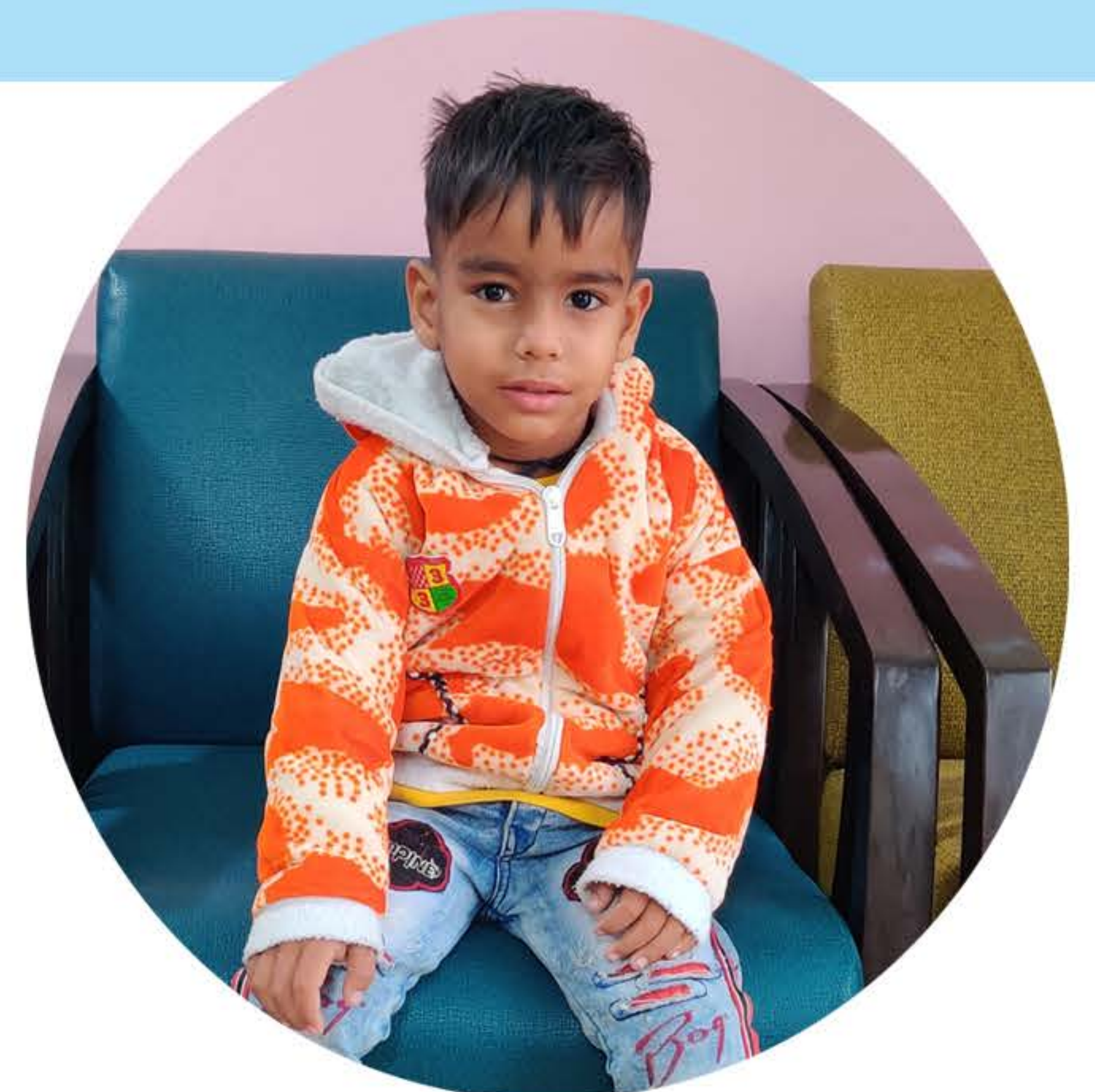

CHF EDUCATION - Hridya Saksham® Echocardiography training for pediatricians and neonatologists-

Due to Covid-19, we could not have many in person echocardiography trainings but we organised various online workshops and knowledge sharing webinars.

HOW COVID 19 AFFECTED US AND HOW WE MANAGED BY ACCEPTING THE NEW NORMAL

During the difficult times of COVID 19 our team's effort in starting to create the screening procedure and awareness on the program had been extremely challenging. With the fear of contracting the virus still prevalent among the crowds it posed a huge challenge for the team to increase the screening numbers. This led to resulting in a lower foot fall of patients in the OPD.

The team had taken up all the safety measures to prevent the contraction of the virus and to assure that the centre has all protective gears and all infrastructural changes within the workspace to ensure everyone's safety. All the staff members were trained on using the protective gears and on the safety guidelines. Whenever a child visited the centre with the parents, they were seated in the safe area after proper sanitization, documents were collected and after thorough sanitization of the ECHO area the procedure was conducted under all safety protocols.

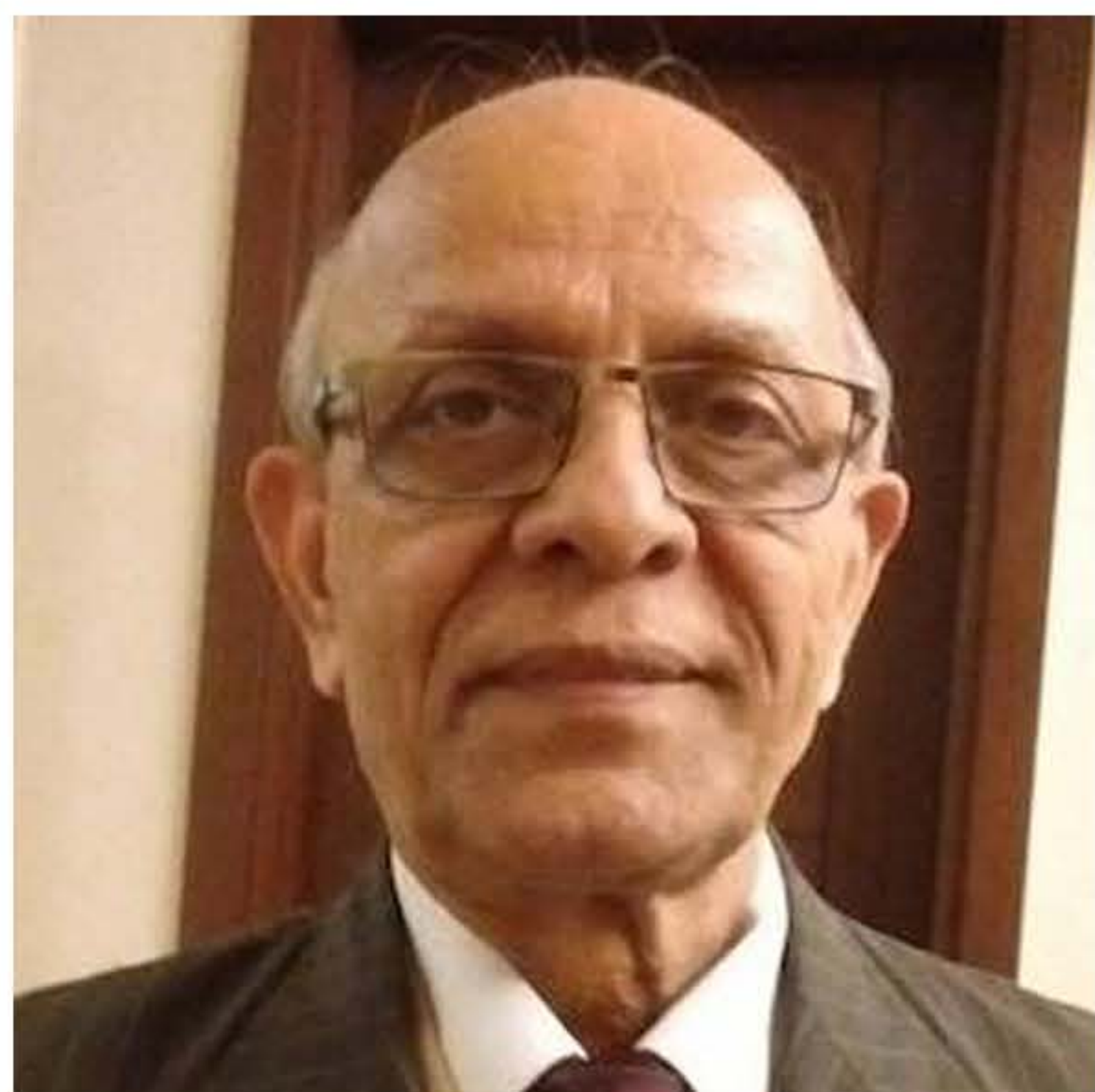

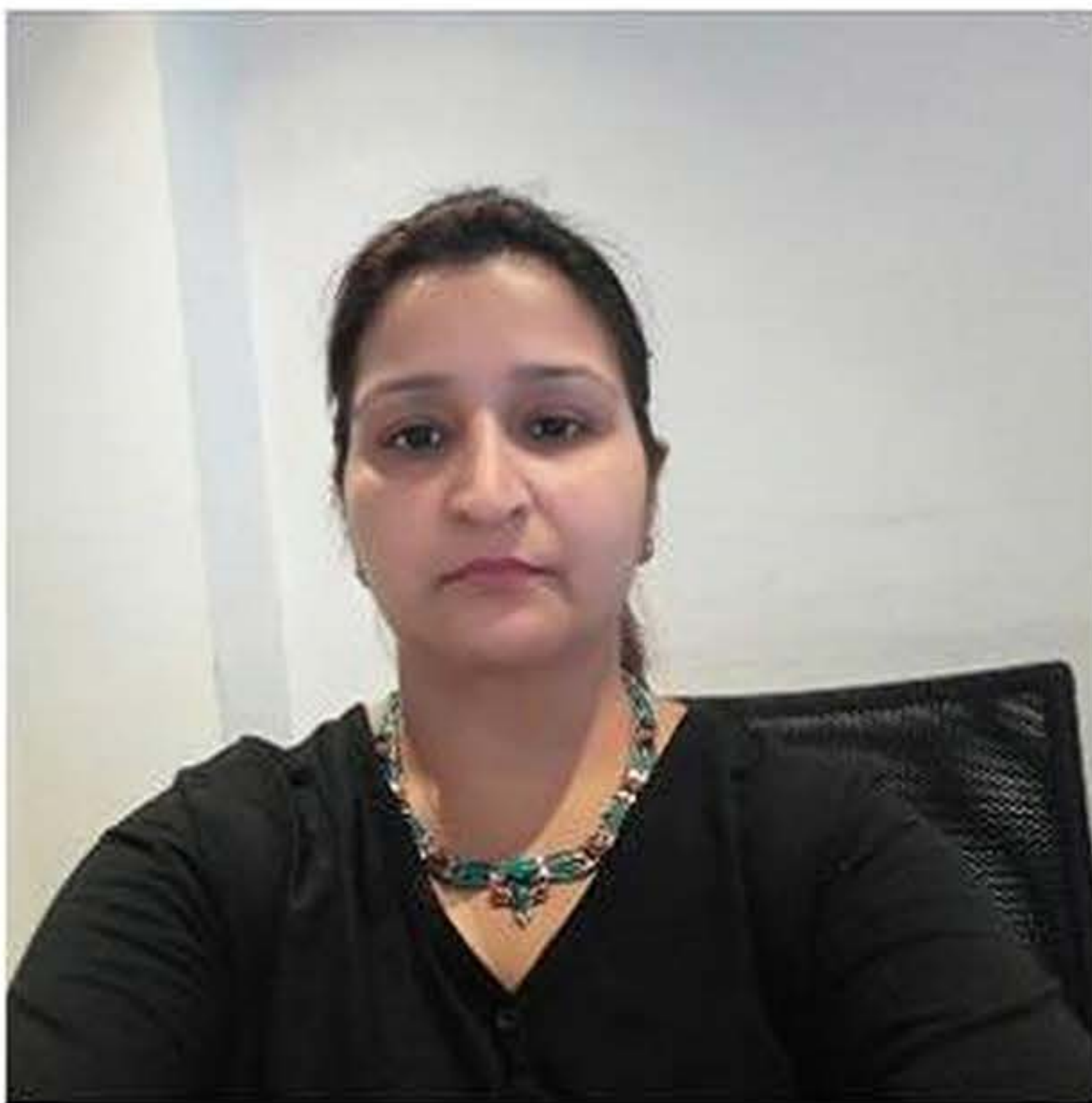


Dr. Poonam Kohli

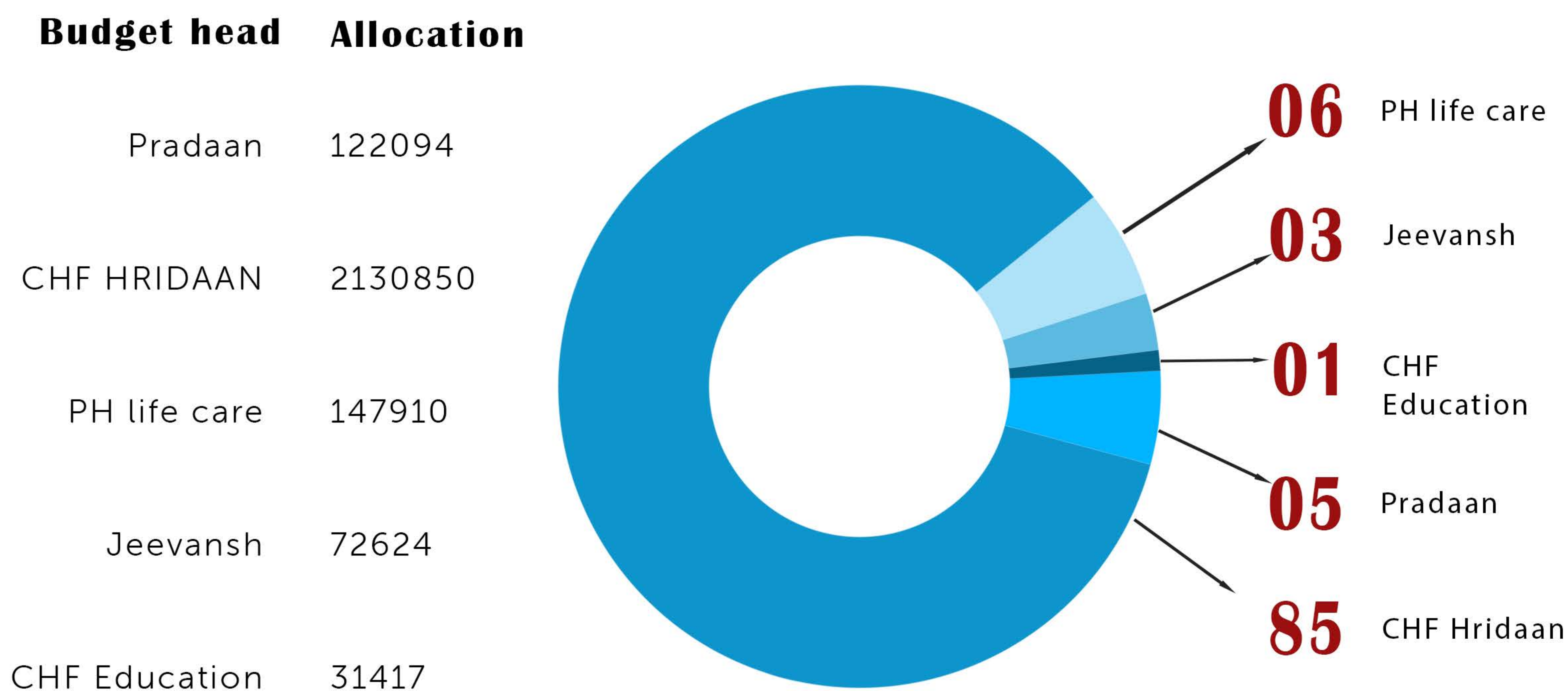

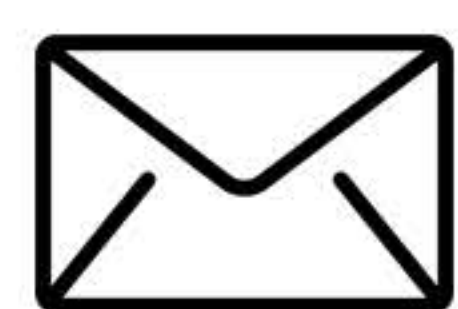
